Marine Program - Coordinator

The Bay Foundation (TBF) is looking for an individual to support its ocean restoration and research program in southern California. Current priorities include restoration and recovery of abalone, kelp forest restoration and research, offshore eelgrass restoration and research, and climate change related oceanographic research.

The Bay Foundation is based in Los Angeles, CA with offices at Loyola Marymount University. Our research vessel and two mariculture labs are located at the Southern California Marine Institute in San Pedro, CA. Additional travel may be required to support dive operations in Point Loma, CA and other southern California locations. TBF's Marine Program conducts field operations 2-4 days per week year-round and occasionally on weekends. As the Marine Coordinator, you will be expected to work from all of these locations.

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Conduct SCUBA based subtidal field work including, data collection, specimen collection, deployment and maintenance of field instruments and equipment, underwater photography and videography.
- Data entry, QAQC, and data analysis.
- Assist with production of data summary products for reporting and grant/project tracking utilizing geospatial and traditional statistical methods and software programs.
- Maintain TBF infrastructure including research vessel, dive gear, field and lab equipment.
- Contribute to permitting processes and reporting.
- Contribute to the operations of The Bay Foundation including, participation and presentations at internal meetings, internal reporting, e.g., diving safety board, program meetings, and staff meetings.
- Support laboratory operations including the care and feeding of abalone, microalgal cultures, life support system operation and maintenance, assist in general care of the facility.
- Represent TBF in professional manner at conferences, symposia, and in other public formats and on social media.
- Present project findings through a variety of forms including presentations, reports, and summaries.
- Effectively communicate with coworkers, supervisors, and project partners.



MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Current AAUS Scientific Diver
- Minimum certified depth to 60 feet, 100 foot preferred
- Nitrox certified
- 100 dives in cold water, kelp forest habitat
- Own dive gear and have proof of service within the last 12 months
- Ability to lift 75 pounds
- Valid driver's license and reliable personal means of transportation
- Enthusiastically support TBF's organizational mission

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's degree in biology, ecology, or similar field. Advanced degree and interest/experience in temperate marine systems preferred
- Experience and proficiency with R, and GIS analytic software, Microsoft Office suite and Google platforms
- Experience operating research vessels, less than 30 feet in length, in coastal waters. Motorboat Operator Training Course, MOTC preferred
- Able to work well under pressure and meet deadlines
- Excellent writing skills

CONSIDERATIONS:

- TBF functions in a team based constructive work environment
- Ability to be flexible, to changes within the work environment and scope of responsibility
- Field work is conducted from a variety of small and large vessels
- Field days may involve long hours and extended transit
- Field work often involves cold water 50 - 57 °F and challenging ocean/weather conditions
- SCUBA equipment is life support equipment and must be cared for as such
- Must value scientific integrity

COMPENSATION:

This is an exempt salaried position with management responsibilities, starting salary range \$52,000-\$55,000 or commensurate with experience. The Bay Foundation offers a competitive compensation package that includes salary, health insurance benefits (medical, dental and vision options), paid holidays, paid time off (PTO), 401k retirement benefits, training, and growth opportunities.
